Your Old, Obsolete and unwanted computers and peripherals (e-waste) will be accepted for recycling or re-use in safe and responsible ways that are compatible with EPA Universal Waste Rules.

Access Project is a non-profit agency that educates and trains people with challenges. They learn to refurbish, demanufacture and recycle electronic equipment along .with life skills to enable them to join the general work-• force. Access Project operates in a 50,000 square foot • facility which houses their work groups and facilities. Equipment that is still functional, easily upgraded or repaired is reused. Obsolete equipment is demanufactured and the components sent to certified vendors for the end life recycling process. Batteries, circuit boards, CRT's, and mercury switches are sent to authorize hazardous material recycling facilities.
